Hallway Expectations

Practice Procedures

- Any time we are transiting to another area of the building (class, lunchroom, recess) we are walking to the right.
- If we are not walking to the right or following any other teacher instructions regarding the hall transits, it is an immediate level drop.
- This means if you were a 5 when you entered the hall and you are not following instructions, you will now be a 4

Practice Procedures

- There is no running in the halls
- There is no horse playing (keep in mind this encompasses a lot of areas)
- There is no yelling (talking is teacher option)
- We are in a single file line
- We should be in order of levels; 5's first, then 4's, etc.
- Also teachers reserve the right to any other misconduct as they foresee it

Classroom Expectations

- Behavior scores are kept for a reason
- The ultimate goal is not to reward students for doing what they should do, but......
- To get all students acting in a reasonable fashion in order to educate all to the standards that need to be taught.
- Ideally, everyone would be a 5 because if you are a 5 you are.....

- 1 Sitting in your seat upon arriving in the classroom
- 2 You are quietly preparing yourself for class
- 3 You have <u>ALL</u> the materials needed for class
- 4 You are waiting for instruction, if it is not already provided
- 5 You are aware of the teacher's presence and the teacher's readiness to speak

These are the basic expectations of <u>EVERY</u>
classroom. If you are meeting these basic
expectations of the classroom, you are probably
starting your way to a 5 for the day.

 But wait.... these expectations do not disappear after the teacher has spoken their initial instructions. No this is the expectation throughout the entire time you are in the class.

- To earn a 4, which incidentally is not our goal with this, you need to be proficient in 4 of the categorical expectations already mentioned. If you are aiming for a 3, then you need to be proficient in 3 of the categorical expectations. Get the idea.
- That said there are behaviors that go beyond the basic classroom expectations

- Those behaviors will be dealt with by the teacher on a case by case basis.
- An example is that if you are booted from my classroom it is an automatic 0 for the day & a detention

Morning Expectations

- All bathroom breaks are over at 9, 8:55 downstairs
- Go to the bathroom when you get here
- No congregating in the bathroom
- If you are caught in the bathroom after 9, it is a level drop
- You must be with your class when they are going upstairs, unless late bus pass, or late pass

Lunch Expectations

- When transiting to the lunch always to the right
- Only go to lockers if given permission
- Enter all doors to the right (such a hard thing to get)
- All tables and floors will be cleaned before we go to recess, if not responsible table or students will serve detention

Detention Expectations

- When released from detention, you are to go as a group staying together directly outside
- <u>Do not stop</u> at lockers, go to the bathroom or get a drink on the way
- Just go outside
- Breaking these expectations could result in level drop

Indoor Recess

- Once you have decided where you are going, you may not leave
- This means no switching, no bathrooms, no lockers
- If you are leaving for the day, someone will come up to let us know
- In emergencies, you need a pass
- If you break any of these expectations, consequence could be immediate level drop

Recess Expectations

- No throwing mulch
- No going back inside
- Be lined up by 3rd whistle
- Line up in 5's, 4's, 3's etc
- As always to the right
